## II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A Honda CRV was stolen from the 21400 block of Chagall Road. Glendale PD recovered the stolen vehicle 4 days later. (19-05937)


A theft from unlocked vehicle was reported in the 1600 block of Stunt Road. The victim left the camper shell of his Toyota Tacoma unlocked while he went for a hike. Four tents, a sleeping bag, and a bag were stolen. (19-05807)

A residential burglary was reported in the 1500 block of Old Topanga Canyon Road. The victim returned to his residence and found his belongings were laying on the floor outside in the front patio. The victim believes the property's handyman broke into his residence and forcefully removed the victim's property in an attempt to kick the victim out. (19-05670)

A residential burglary was reported in the 21700 block of Planewood Drive. The victim forgot to close his garage door and left it open all night. The next morning, the victim's unlocked vehicle, which was parked in the garage, was found ransacked. Tools were stolen from the garage. A tool bag containing various small tools was stolen from the victim's unlocked truck, which was parked in the driveway. (19-06141)
