II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS

A residential burglary was reported in the 180 block of Comanche. There were no signs of forced entry. The victim was unable to determine what was stolen at the time of the report. (17-02371)

A residential burglary occurred in the 2400 block of Old Topanga Canyon Road. Person(s) unknown made entry into the home through an unlocked door or window. A guitar, speaker and a typewriter were taken. (17-02246)

Six incidents of theft from an unlocked vehicle were reported this month. The incidents occurred in the 500 block of Fernwood Pacific Drive, 2300 block of Nuez Way, 20600 block of Callon Drive, 21000 block of Stonewall Trail, 21100 block of Bellini Drive and the 21800 block of Canon Drive. Property taken consisted of duffel bag, clothing, a camera, surfboards, wetsuits, wallets, debit cards, credit cards, driver's license, cell phone and cash. In one incident (Stonewall Trail), video footage showed three unknown suspects walking around the area checking for unlocked vehicles. Two of the suspects were wearing hooded sweatshirt, masks and gloves. In another incident (Canon Drive), a stolen credit card was used at the Northridge Pac-Sun store by an unknown suspect. A Calabasas resident was arrested for robbery in the 17400 block of Ventura Blvd in Encino. The subject committed a carjacking last month in the 23700 block of Mulholland Highway in Calabasas. The victim was the subject's mother. This subject and her three companions (residents of Newhall, Los Angeles and a transient) were also charged with identity theft, false personation of another, possession of identity theft information with previous conviction, narcotic charges and receiving stolen property. Stolen property taken during a theft of a vehicle that occurred in the jurisdiction of the Los Angeles Police Department's Devonshire Division was recovered in the subjects' possession including stolen property taken from the jurisdictions of the Glendale Police Department's and the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department Santa Clarita Valley Station. This subject and companions are prolific theft suspects and are possibly responsible for several theft incidents in the Topanga and Calabasas areas. (17-02031)

A motorcycle was stolen in the area of Topanga Canyon Road and Topanga School Road. The motorcycle is still outstanding. No suspect(s) seen or heard. (17-02386)

A resident was arrested for domestic violence in the 2400 block of Liberty Lane. The suspect assaulted her husband during an argument. (17-02403)

II. NOTEWORTHY INCIDENTS (Continued)

Three vehicle burglaries occurred during the same date and time frames. The location of the incidents were the 3100 blocks of Heidi Lane and Rossini Place and the 21400 block of Lighthill Drive. Property taken consisted of vehicle registration papers, a wallet with its contents, checkbook, a tennis racket, earthquake kit and a backpack. Video footage showed a male adult enter the victim's vehicle and take property from inside. A female adult is then seen in a possibly late 1990's Honda Accord loading the stolen property into the vehicle. Both suspects fled in the vehicle. (17-02168, 02169, 02170)

A call was received regarding a family disturbance/attempt suicide in the 2600 block of Henry Ridge Mountain Way. The subject of the call was arrested for theft and vandalism. (17-02097)
